

**DENTAL DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Your pet has had a dental cleaning (prophylaxis). The teeth were x-rayed, examined, cleaned, polished and Oravet treated.
2. There were \_\_\_\_\_ extractions.
3. A small amount of food and water can be offered this evening, when you get home. If there were extractions, canned or moist food may be offered. It may take 24 hours for your pet's appetite to return. Some animals are nauseous after anesthesia.

5. Following anesthesia, patients may have loose stool, or may have a bowel movement for 24 to 36 hours. If this lasts for more than 36 hours, please call.
6. Brushing your pet's teeth is recommended. To start, use an old washcloth and a small amount of warm water. Lift up your pet's lips and do a brushing motion. After a week, move onto a toothbrush and toothpaste specially designed for dogs and cats. (Available here for \$1.00)
7. If you are able to brush your pet's teeth, Oravet plaque prevention gel can be applied to your pet's teeth weekly at home to maintain the Oravet Barrier Sealant that was applied to your pet's teeth.
8. There is a bandage on the front leg where the intravenous catheter was. It can be removed (unwrapped or pushed off) after 7:00 pm, this evening.
9. A dental diet, Science Diet Hill's Prescription T/D, is available to aid in the reduction of accumulation of plaque, stain, and tartar. This can be used in addition to your regular food or as treats.
